Sermon Recap

- Christian art has portrayed Jesus’ physical appearance in a variety of ways over the last two-thousand years. Jesus’ physical appearance ultimately doesn’t matter, but the image of Christ in the world today is of vital importance.
- St. Paul says we are the “body of Christ,” or the presence of Christ.
- Pentecost is about God’s Spirit empowering us to be like Jesus
- The Corinthian Church is a portrait of what a congregation looks like that forsakes the power and presence of God’s Spirit.

2. How do you feel about the responsibility placed on us to be the presence of Christ in the world today?
3. Pastor Jonathan said that “we are always a witness of Christ’s presence in the world. Sometimes we are good witnesses and sometimes we are poor witnesses. Either way, we are how the world sees Jesus.” Explain what you think this means in your own words.
4. What can we learn from the Corinthians trying to continue to be Christ’s presence in the world apart from the power of God’s Spirit?
5. How have you witnessed God’s grace recently?
6. How can we pray for you?
